Weeks later, at an event where he was speaking, the Judge referred to this case as an example to demonstrate the importance of pro bono assistance.

Thanks to Bella's assistance the final hearing was vacated, and the matters were swiftly resolved, which would not have been possible without Bella's assistance. Has your Chambers signed up to The Chambers Pro Bono Framework?


Advocate have recently introduced The
